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# What is LCAP?

- California launched a significant change to how schools are funded in 2013.
- This new Local Control Funding Formula determines funding based on an unduplicated count of students who meet the criteria set by the state for low income, English Language Learners and Foster youth.
- As a result, each school is required to create a Local Control and Accountability Plan often called the LCAP.
- Last spring, we sent a survey out to gather ideas from all of our stakeholders (parents, staff, students) on what was working under the current LCAP plan and what we hoped to change for the 2016-2017 school year.

# Goal 1: Increase percent of students who are on-track to graduate college and career ready

## Action Steps:

1. Provide Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) teacher training
2. Support Project Lead the Way program instruction
3. Purchase Project Lead the Way materials & provide PLTW teacher certification training
4. Hire a Project Lead the Way/Career & Technical Education (CTE) Coordinator
5. Purchase online Brighton College CTE courses
6. Support CTE class fees with local school districts
7. Provide ESi (ES Instruction) courses for High School core subjects and CTE subjects
8. Hire a Guidance Coordinator
9. Provide weekly Webwise a-g online classes for students enrolled in a-g courses
10. Purchase lab materials for a-g labs
11. Provide instructional support for a-g labs
12. Create a-g course revisions to a-g syllabi with stipends

## Goal 2: Increase the achievement of low performing students in English and Math.

### Action Steps:

1. Track CAASPP data
2. Purchase i-Ready intervention curriculum
3. Provide i-Ready webinars for teachers and parents
4. Purchase online intervention curriculum
5. Purchase print intervention curriculum
6. Provide online, in person or group intervention tutoring for students scoring 2 grade levels below
7. Hire High School Online Curriculum Expert(s) to be a resource to teachers, student and parents
8. Hire Intervention Curriculum Experts to be a resource to teachers, student and parents
9. Provide ESi (ES Instruction) tutoring for intervention students
10. Provide ESi small group tutoring for special education students
11. Purchase Writing Initiative materials (stipends and materials)
12. Hire a Lead Intervention Curriculum Expert to coordinate and oversee intervention experts
13. Establish the Resource Center

## Goal 3: Increase the percentage of EL students who achieve proficiency in English Language Arts & Math.

### Action Steps:

1. Provide computers and MiFi for internet access for EL students for internet/intervention services
2. Provide ESi supplemental online tutoring for EL students
3. Provide online or in person tutoring for EL students with vendors
4. Purchase EL online curriculum
5. Purchase alternative print/online EL curriculum for EL students
